

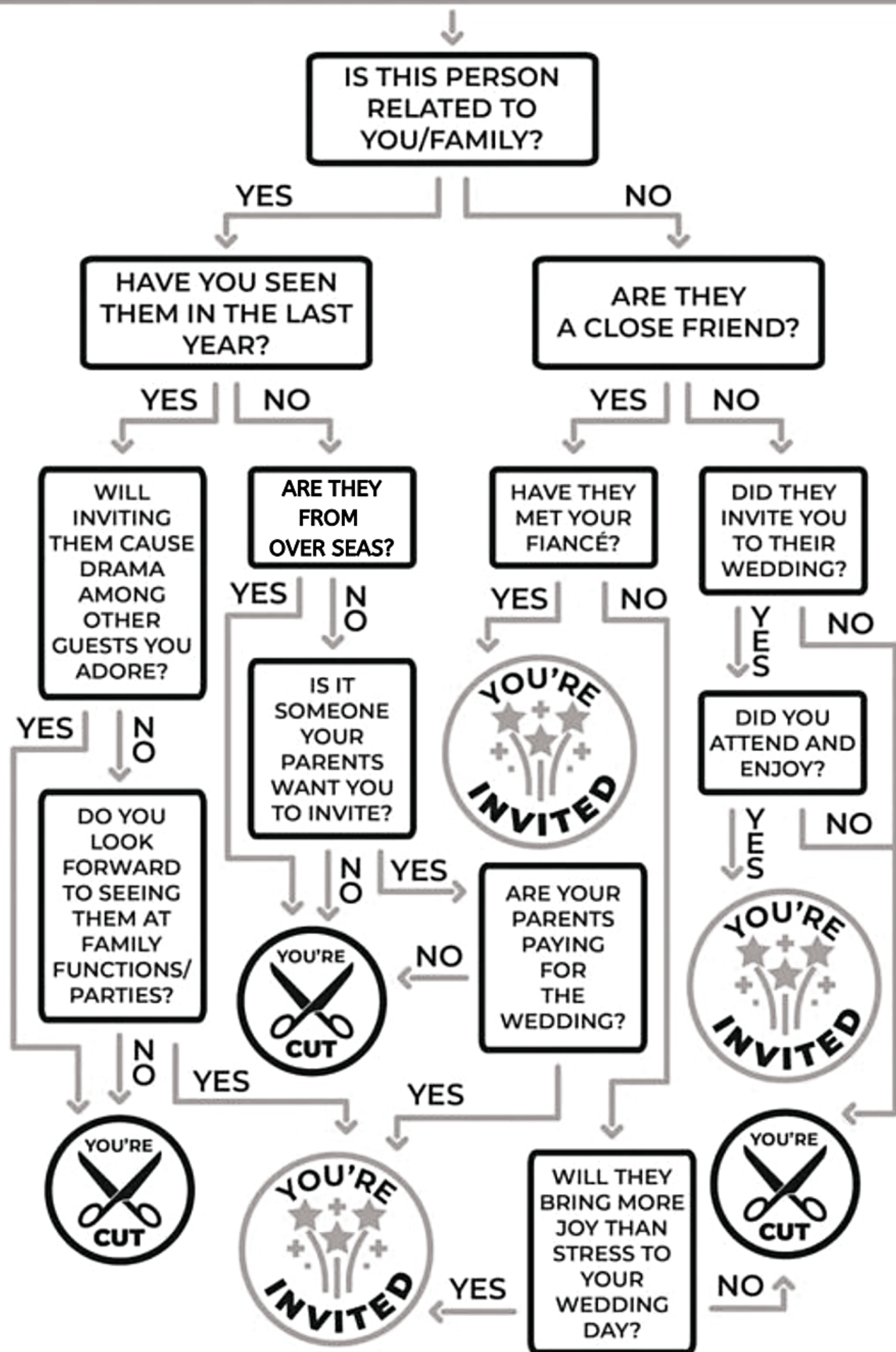

FIVE QUICK TIPS FOR YOUR WEDDING GUEST LIST

1

Give a plus one to . . .

Couples who are engaged, married or live together.
All members of the bridal party. Guests in a serious relationship.
Special guests who won't know anyone else.

Try this hack if you have limited venue space. . .

On your RSVP cards, use this phrase:
"We have reserved __seat/s in your honour"

When to send B list invitations

Send your first round of invites around 10 to 12 weeks before your wedding, send B list invites around 8 weeks ahead of your wedding, or as soon as your first list decline.

4

Adults only wedding etiquette

Address your envelopes to the parents only and be sure to reference in your invites that the wedding is for adults only. To make your preference even clearer see tip 2.
